- \succ The college has been consistently excelling in research. The Department of Physics is executing one Major Research Project funded by Science & Engineering Research Board, DST, Govt. of India (Vide No. EEQ/2022/001082 DT. 07/03/2023).
- > The college has been organising Seminars both in State Level, National Level and in International Level.
- The college can boast of excellent laboratory and library resources.
- > The college has learned faculty members involved in publishing Papers, Article, Books and Book chapters of national and international repute.
- ➤ The college has several schemes to support the girl students in particular. There are schemes like Kanyashree, and Aikyashree and Oasis Government of West Bengal Both boys and girls can also avail Swami Vivekananda Meritcum-means Scholarships. Credit card
- > The college authority has started MoU related dialogue with Professor Mostafa Elachouri, a leading North African Ethnobotanist of the Biology Department, Mohammed Premier University, and Oujda, Morocco, who visited the college during November-December 2022.
- > The college authority has started MoU related dialogue MoU in between Central Library of KU and this college.

Weakness:

- \succ The principal weakness is dearth of communication. The college is located 35 km away from the nearest railway station Krishnagar and 13 km away from nearest bus stoppage, Chapra Srinagar morh. Moreover, no bus service is available. Only Auto service is there and is costly enough for students and staff.
- > The college is running without Boys' Hostel, Girls' Hostel, Quarters for teaching and non-teaching staff and Principal's Quarter.
- No Gymnasium is available for students.
- The college is located in rural area and harbouring a rich resource of animal and plant biodiversity. In spite of these, the college is running without Zoology and Botany.
- > Number of computers: Number of students (3:163) very poor.

Opportunities:

- > There is ample opportunity to introduce Honours subjects like Botany, Zoology, Physiology, Biochemistry and Statistics (Subjects of Biological disciplines) as per recommendations from competent authorities.
- Introduction of more ICT-equipped smart class rooms.
- Establishment of a large garden for indigenous medicinal plants having sustainability within the college campus.
- Establishment of a Zoological Museum and Herbarium for creating consciousness on local fauna and flora respectively.
- Immediate upgradation of Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics from general degree to honours degree.
- The College may be focused as the Centre for Biodiversity Conservation' as well as centre for wild cultivated threatened plants.

Challenges:

- Improvement of the college infrastructure with special reference to the construction of Girls' and Boys' Hostels for maximum number of students, as they come from distant places.
- The college has immediate need to start construction of Staff quarters and Principal's quarter.
- Time bound Bus services with subsidised fare need to be introduced from Chapra to the college campus for students coming from challenged socio-economic back ground.
- Centralized Computer Lab for entire college with Wi Fi facility.
- Value Added Certificate courses/Job oriented courses need to be started
- More Honours courses especially Botany, Zoology, Education, Philosophy, Geography, Statistics, and need to be introduced.
- UGC 2f and 12(B) certifications be immediately granted and Government should take necessary efforts in this regard.
- Industry interaction be initiated immediately.
- Vast area of Backside is open [not fenced since beginning] due to forcefully cultivated land encroachment by the local villagers of Shikra village since its beginning. Several meetings with BLRO Chapra Block along with local villagers conducted, still 3 villagers are inclined to leave this vested Govt land.

Alternatively, teachers convey their messages directly to the parents. The Practice: Teachers used to keep all records for each student in a Record Register. Particular Departmental teachers are present in their departmental room and parents are requested to sit inside this room before schedule time. Teachers call parents one by one and briefed the lacunae/weakness/strength of a particular student in front of each parent. Teachers also provide some suggestions for the better understanding of

Problems Encountered and Resources required: Presence of parents' percentage is decreasing day by day, especially after Covid 19 Pandemic. Parents said that it is due to remote locality with poor transport and most of the parents are cultivators who are forced to go to the fields for their parents are cultivators. daily earning.

Title of the Practice: Free Health Check up for the students of this remote area

Objectives of the Practice: Every 6-month interval one Free Health check-up is organized by Chapra BMOH on our request.

The Context: As the college is located at the outskirts of the village Shikra, about 14 km from Chapra town, and as most of the students are coming

from other remote villages, regular free health checks up in presence of MBBS Doctor is organized. The Practice: As the numbers of female students are more, therefore, Chapra BMOH used to nominate one Lady doctor every time. All students are gathered in the 1st Floor Auditorium where our faculty and teaching associated staff are also present. Doctor is requested to on the Dias. Firstly, Doctor made groups of 8 students and calls each group one by one. Firstly, Doctor consults our female students and enquire their problems one by one. After enquiry, Doctor used to provide some medicines to our poor students also. Doctor also provides some vitamins, nutrition-rich tablets,

ORS etc. to our students. Doctor also consums our male students, similar way one by one.

Problems Encountered and Resources required: No problem arises yet, but we need Free Health Check-up at an interval of every three months.

Objectives of the Practice: To aware villagers of nearby villages, every year our NSS Unit organizes 'Covid-19 viral fever', 'Safe drive save life', Title of the Practice: Organization of regular-basis social awareness programmes by our NSS students. 'Dengue viral fever' etc.

Every year we used to each village for campaigning the awareness programmes. We campaigned mainly two nearby villages Shikra and Hatkhola. Objectives of the Practice: To aware UG students from the beginning about the importance of local biodiversity, GGDC Chapra has initiated Local Biodiversity-based Environmental studies Project in a meeting on 5th June 2022 on the eve of 'World Environment Day'

The Context: Practical-based Environment-related project is required to understand the environment and its biodiversity in real sense. Thinking the need of Practical-based Environment Project, we have initiated this project from November 2022. Total 16 students submitted their Projects based

The Practice: Before sending the Project Format, one lecture was conducted in 1st Floor Auditorium regarding how they execute this field-based environment project. After the lecture students were provided one blank Format entitled "Studies of Local Biodiversity". In this Format, detailed information was mentioned like particular Locality, GP, Block, GPS coordinates, altitude, Date of field visit, Local name of plants and their live images, local name of animals and their live images, Rarity and present status of these plants and animals in this locality, medicinal importance of these plants if any etc. Total 16 Projects were submitted by the students for the first time. These Projects were kept in Biodiversity & Conservation

Problems Encountered and Resources required: Due to shortage of funds, we could not print all projects, but we have all soft copy pdfs. Only 40% students submitted this Project, but most students from Programme courses did not submit yet.
