

H. Outcome of the Seminar:

The seminar was conducted successfully by the Department of Political Science, Government General Degree College, Chapra. The students participated in the same with great enthusiasm. They were acquainted with the following concepts and discussions,

1.Caste, India's ancient social hierarchy, deeply influences its political landscape. Caste acts as a potent force in elections, mobilizing voters and shaping party alliances. Parties often position themselves as representing specific caste groups. This leads to both cohesion within castes and potential tensions between them. Reservations for disadvantaged castes aim to improve

representation and equality. However, the system also faces criticism for perpetuating caste consciousness.

- 2. Caste system and British rule: The caste system is a social hierarchy in India. It was seen by the British as a way to understand Indian society. They used it to justify their rule and it led to conflicts among different castes.
- 3. Evolution of caste: Efforts to abolish untouchability and promote equality were present. However, caste continued to exist and evolve in Indian society. The Constitution of India banned untouchability and introduced reservations for lower castes. This further solidified the importance of caste.
- 4. Political co-optation: Political parties started mobilizing lower castes and including them in their ranks. This gave these castes a chance to assert their identity and seek political power.
- 5. Dominant castes and political power: Dominant castes hold numerical superiority. Thus, they enjoy political influence. Politicians find caste a useful instrument during elections. Competition among major caste groups for power is often observed in Indian states.
- 6. Reservation and backward classes: Caste-based reservations were introduced in the Indian Constitution. This was to provide opportunities and advancement for socially and educationally backward classes. The Mandal Commission identified backward classes primarily based on caste membership.
- 7. Interplay of class and caste: Over time, class and caste started coexisting in Indian society. Reservation policies helped certain castes catch up with other dominant castes. However, this also led to socio-economic differentiation within caste groups.
- 8. Changing dynamics: Caste continues to be a lived social reality in India. Despite the erosion of its ideological basis, it has become an instrument of social change. Caste identities have taken new forms of articulation, resulting in the rise of identity politics.
- 9. Complex relationship: The relationship between class and caste is complex and overlapping. The struggle for status and equality continues, and caste remains a potent form of social identity. The transformation of caste into interest groups has also influenced politics.







- 2. Public policy falls into four main types: substantive, regulation, distribution, and redistribution. Each serves distinct purposes and addresses specific societal challenges. Whether it's shaping laws, allocating resources, or ensuring fairness, understanding these categories illuminates the multifaceted nature of policymaking.
- 3. India has a long history of public policy dating back to ancient times. The Arthashastra, written by Chanakya in the 4th century BCE, is considered one of the earliest texts on public policy. During British colonial rule, the Indian government was heavily influenced by Western ideas and models of governance. The British introduced laws and regulations that were designed to promote their own interests rather than those of the Indian people.
- 4. After independence in 1947, India adopted a democratic system of government based on the principles of secularism, socialism, and federalism. In the early years of independent India, public policy focused primarily on nation-building and promoting rapid industrialization. Over time, public policy in India has evolved to address emerging challenges and opportunities. More recently, initiatives like Digital India and Make in India reflect the country's growing ambition to become a digital and manufacturing powerhouse.
- 5. The evolution of public policy in India has been influenced by various factors, such as the legacy of colonialism, the diversity and complexity of Indian society, the aspirations and expectations of the people. The public policy topics in India have been varied and dynamic, ranging from the core issues of nation-building, development, and security. The public policy making in India has been characterized by a mix of continuity and change, consensus and conflict, centralization and decentralization, and participation and exclusion.
- 6. Public policy in India is characterized by a number of features that shape its nature and direction. It includes policies and regulations that govern various sectors such as education, health, agriculture, industry, environment, and transportation, among others. 





H. Outcome of the Seminar:

The seminar was conducted successfully by the Department of Political Science, Government General Degree College, Chapra. The students participated enthusiastically in the same. They were acquainted with the following concepts and discussions in the Seminar,

1. Politics is the way that people living in groups make planned decisions. Politics is about making agreements between people so that they can live together in groups such as tribes, cities, or countries. In large groups, such as countries, some people may spend a lot of their time making such agreements. These people are called politicians. Politicians, and sometimes other people, may get together to form a government. The study of politics in universities is

called political science, public affairs, government, political studies, or public administration. In everyday life, the term "politics" refers to the way that countries are governed, and to the ways that governments make rules and laws to manage the human society properly. Politics can also be seen in other groups, such as in companies, clubs, schools, and churches.

- 2. The Greek philosopher Aristotle wrote that humans are a political animal and that ethics and politics are closely linked. Niccolò Machiavelli wrote, in his 1532 book, The Prince, that politics was firstly about having and keeping power. He said that without power, a leader could do nothing. In 1651, Thomas Hobbes wrote Leviathan, a book about politics. Hobbes wrote that people living in groups often give up some of their rights in exchange for some protections from a government. This is the basis of the social contract theory. In the 1800s, John Stuart Mill developed the "liberal" idea of politics. Mill said that democracy is the most important political development of the 1800s. He said that there should be more protection for individual rights against the government. Bernard Crick wrote a list of the political virtues, which were about best practices of politics itself.
- 3. Western political thought began with the ancient Greeks. Greek philosophers like Plato and Aristotle discussed justice, good governance and the state. Western political thought is based on Greek philosophy. The Ancient Romans extended the ideas of the Greeks. They valued ideas like the rule of law and representative government. The Roman concept of natural law also influenced Western political thought.
- 4. Greek and Roman ideas were adopted by Christian thinkers during medieval times. During medieval times, Christian thinkers emphasised the idea of natural law and natural rights. Saint Thomas Aquinas combined Aristotelian philosophy with Christianity.
- 5. The Renaissance period saw the revival of interest in the ideas of Ancient Greece and Rome. Renaissance thinkers emphasised ideas of human reason and individual liberty. They broke from Church domination and stressed the importance of secular authority.
- 6. Modern Western political thought began in the 17th and 18th centuries. Thinkers like Hobbes, Locke and Rousseau shaped modern political ideas based on the social contract, natural rights and republicanism. Thomas Hobbes focused on the social contract in his work 'Leviathan'. He talked about the need for people to transfer some rights to a sovereign authority to establish political order. John Locke advocated the idea of natural rights and consent in his work 'Two Treatises of Government'. He talked about individual rights to life, liberty and property. He believed people consent to the government to protect these rights. Jean Jacques Rousseau discussed the idea of the general will and republican government in works like 'The Social Contract'. He believed people should come together to form popular sovereignty based on the citizens' general will.
- 7. The Age of Enlightenment thinkers valued reason and scientific thought. They criticised irrational traditions and absolutism. They talked about ideas like self-interest, separation of powers and limits on government. The 19th century saw a debate between classical liberalism and conservatism. Liberals valued individual freedoms and limited government. Conservatives believed in traditions and institutions.
- 8. 20th-century Western political thought was shaped by socialism, fascism, welfare capitalism and liberal democracy. Thinkers debated the role of the state in the economy and society. The idea of human rights became important. In short, western political thought evolved from

ancient Greco-Roman ideas to liberal democracy and human rights ideas prevalent today. Key values shaped by Western political thought are individual liberty, the rule of law, limited government, consent of the governed and democracy.

9. Western political thought laid the base of political systems in Western countries like the USA, European countries and other liberal democracies. It values ideas like liberty, equality, property rights and representation which form the basis of the Western style of governance.

H. Outcome of the Seminar:

The seminar was conducted successfully by the Department of Political Science, Government General Degree College, Chapra. The students participated in the same with great enthusiasm. They were acquainted with the following concepts and discussions,

- 1. Home to a large number of tribal people, known as Adivasis, India has the second largest tribal population in the world. Tribal Communities are a integral segment of Indian society since the days of the Ramayana and the Mahabharata. The tribal people through the country have rich traditions, cultures and heritage with unique life styles and customs. Despite some regional variation, the tribes share many common traits, including living in relative geographical isolation, and being relatively more homogeneous and more self-contained than the non-tribal social groups.
- 2. The areas inhabited by the tribal constitute a significant part of the under developed areas of the country. India's population includes nearly one hundred million tribal people. The two main regions of tribal settlement are the country's northeastern states bordering China and Burma, and the highlands and plains of its central and southern regions. The latter is home to more than 80 per cent of the tribes, which differ from the northeastern tribes in ethnicity and in having experienced greater "intrusion of the Indian mainstream and of the pan-Indian model of the state, society, economy and culture". There are also differences in the extent to which

the tribes interact with non-tribal communities. While the northeastern tribes are usually isolated communities, the tribes in peninsular India may at times coexist with non-tribal people.


- 3. The Scheduled Areas and Scheduled Tribes Commission appointed by the President of India on 28 April 1960 pursuant to Article 339 of the Constitution of India in its report of 14 October 1961 stated that "As these groups are presumed to form the oldest ethnological sector of the population, the term "Adivasi" ('Adi'= original and 'Vasi'= inhabitant) has become current among certain people. The International Labour Organization has classified such people as "indigenous". The Government of India has initiated a number of steps to develop socio economic conditions of tribal population in the country.
- 4. Recognizing the need to protect the socio-cultural fabric of tribal communities and underscoring their role in nation-building, the makers of the Constitution of India made special provisions for the protection of tribal culture and the development of Scheduled Tribes. These include the conservation of their language, script and other cultural elements, ensuring their educational interests, providing economic safeguards and taking steps for political empowerment.
- 5. Apart from the above constitutional safeguards, a separate Ministry named the Ministry of Tribal Affairs was set up in 1999 with the objective of providing a more focused approach to the integrated socio-economic development of the Scheduled Tribes (STs). The programmes and schemes of the Ministry are intended to support and supplement other Central Ministries, State Governments and voluntary organizations and to fill critical gaps in institutions and programmes, taking into account the situation of STs through financial assistance.
- 6. In another initiative for tribal empowerment, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 (In short FRA) was enacted by the Parliament to recognize and vest forest rights in the Forest Dwelling Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers who have been residing in forest land for generations, but whose rights on ancestral lands and their habitat were not adequately recognized resulting in historical injustice to them. The Act came into effect on 31.12.2007. The Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Rules, 2007 were notified on 01.01.2008. Under this act, total Community rights given up to May 2014 was 23,578 whereas during the period from 2014 to June 2023, 86,621 community rights have been given across the country. The total extent of land distributed during the period from the inception of FRA to May 2014 was 55.30 lakh acres whereas, during the period from 2014 to June 2023, 122.60 lakh acres have been given, which is almost double the figure during the period till May 2014. A total of 177.90 lakh acres of forest land (47.56 lakh acres individual and 130.34 lakh acres community) has been distributed up to 30.06.2023 across the country.
- 7. Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRS) have been set up to provide quality education to ST students (Class VI-XII) in remote areas through residential schooling facilities. Presently, more than 1.2 lakh students are enrolled in 401 EMRS. It is noteworthy to know that the number of female students (60,815) in EMRSs exceeds that of male students (59,255). Moreover, a total of 38,000 teachers and support staff are being recruited for the Ekalavya Model Residential Schools which will benefit 3.5 lakh tribal students. A number of Fellowship and Scholarship Programmes have also been launched to provide financial assistance to ST students for studies ranging from pre-matric and post-matric levels to the pursuit of higher education and studies abroad. Notably, during the last nine years, a total of 3.15 Crore tribal students have

received scholarships/fellowships of over Rs. 17,087 Crore (from April 2014 till September 2023).

- 8. Prioritizing the welfare of tribal communities, the budget allocation of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs has been substantially increased from Rs.4295.94 crore in 2013-14 to Rs.12461.88 crore in 2023-24 i.e., an increase of around 190.01%. Funds are released to States under Article 275(1) of the Constitution to enable them to meet the cost of such schemes of development as may be undertaken by the State for the purpose of promoting tribal welfare. Under the Pradhan Mantri Vanbandhu Vikas Yojana, a venture capital fund has been set up to promote entrepreneurship/start-up projects by ST youth. Minimum Support Price (MSP) is ensured for Minor Forest Produce, and marketing support for tribal products is provided through the Pradhan Mantri Jan Jatiya Vikas Mission. Under this mission, the total number of Van Dhan Vikas Kendra (VDVK) sanctioned is 3958 while an amount of Rs. 398.49 crore has been disbursed. A total number of 183412 tribal persons is associated with this scheme. In addition, financial aid is provided to Voluntary Organizations working for the welfare of Scheduled Tribes for projects in education, health and livelihood.
- 9. TRIFED, (Tribal Cooperative Marketing Development Federation of India) supports retail marketing for livelihood development among tribal communities of India. A provision of Rs. 288 crores has also been made in the annual budget estimate for the fiscal year 2023-24 to be implemented through TRIFED, specifically through the formation of Self-Help Groups and producer enterprises. Under TRIFED, a Central Sector Scheme 'Marketing and Logistics Development for Promotion of Tribal Products from North -Eastern Region (PTP-NER)', was launched for the benefit of Scheduled Tribes of the Northeastern Region, in Manipur on 18th April, 2023.





H. Outcome of the Seminar:

The seminar was conducted successfully by the Department of Political Science, Government General Degree College, Chapra. The students participated in the same with great enthusiasm. They were acquainted with the following concepts and discussions,

- 1. Sustainable livelihoods approaches were developed in the 1980s by different development agencies and organizations and, especially since the 1990s, have been adopted by many as a framework for looking at development issues and addressing poverty. SL approaches emerged from the growing realization of the need to put the poor and all aspects of their lives and means of living at the centre of development, while at the same time maintaining the sustainability of natural resources for present and future generations.
- 2. Livelihood, as understood in SL approaches, can be defined as follows:

A livelihood comprises the capabilities, assets (including both material and social resources) and activities required for a means of living. A livelihood is sustainable when it can cope with and recover from stresses and shocks and maintain or enhance its capabilities and assets both now and in the future, while not undermining the natural resource base .

3. While the SL approaches used by different development agencies and NGOs vary, they are generally characterized by the following elements:

People-centred, with a focus on the poor;

Responsive and participatory;

Multi-level;

Conducted in partnership;

Sustainable; and

Dynamic.

4. The particular sustainable livelihoods framework developed by the Department for International Development (DFID) contains the following elements:

An analysis of the causes of vulnerability, including trends, shocks and seasonality;

An analysis of livelihood assets at the individual, household and community level, comprising human, social, financial, physical and natural resource capital;

The context within which livelihoods evolve, including micro and macro level policies; civic, economic and cultural institutions; laws and governance;

Livelihoods strategies; and

Livelihood outcomes, assessed in terms of reduced vulnerability, more food security, more income, increased well-being, and sustainable use of natural resource base.

- 5. Policy can be defined as 'course of action designed to achieve particular goals or targets'. Public policy is made by government to achieve particular national outcomes. Private organizations or communities may also form their own policy to achieve defined goals. While this definition of the term 'policy' is succinct, literature on SL approaches agrees that policy is complex, dynamic and difficult to define. Moreover, policy cannot be understood in isolation, but must be examined in context and as part of a process. A government, organization or other entity may issue a policy statement, but policy formulation and implementation is mediated through a wide range of institutions and organizations.
- 6. Policy processes encompass:

Formulation, involving information gathering, analysis and decision-making.

Implementation, generally involving a set of rules, regulations and institutions to achieve the goals of the policy.

Monitoring and evaluation of the formulation and implementation of policy.

There are a wide variety of theories of policy and policy making. A widely-held view is the linear model (also called the mainstream, common-sense or rational model). This assumes that policy making is a rational, logical process that moves through sequential stages.

Recognizing and defining the nature of the issues at hand.

Identifying possible courses of action to deal with these issues.

Weighing the advantages and disadvantage of these alternatives.

Choosing the option that offers the best solution.

Implementing the policy.

Possible evaluation of the outcome.

- 7. In real life situations, however, policy processes tend to be more complex: "policy processes are often distinctly non-linear, inherently political and contested, and more incremental and haphazard" than the linear model suggests (Keeley 2001: 9). Moreover, implementation of policy "requires consensus building, participation of key stakeholders, conflict resolution, compromise, contingency planning, resource mobilisation and adaptation".
- 8. Concepts of participation have widened to include not only the rural poor but also other stakeholders and sectors of civil society. This is reflected in the definition of participation as "a process through which stakeholders influence and share control over development initiatives and the decisions and resources which affect them".

H. Outcome of the Seminar:

The seminar was conducted successfully by the Department of Political Science, Government General Degree College, Chapra. The students participated in the same with great enthusiasm. They were acquainted with the following concepts and discussions from the seminar,

1. Relatively little is known for certain about Machiavelli's early life in comparison with many important figures of the Italian Renaissance (the following section draws on Capponi 2010; Vivanti 2013; Celenza 2015; Lee 2020) He was born 3 May 1469 in Florence and at a young

age became a pupil of a renowned Latin teacher, Paolo da Ronciglione. It is speculated that he attended the University of Florence, and even a cursory glance at his corpus reveals that he received an excellent humanist education. It is only with his entrance into public view, with his appointment in 1498 as the Second Chancellor of the Republic of Florence, however, that we begin to acquire a full and accurate picture of his life. For the next fourteen years, Machiavelli engaged in a flurry of diplomatic activity on behalf of Florence, traveling to the major centers of Italy as well as to the royal court of France and to the imperial curia of Maximilian.

- 2. The first of his writings in a more reflective vein was also ultimately the one most commonly associated with his name, The Prince. Penned at the end of 1513 (and perhaps early 1514), but only published posthumously in 1532, The Prince was composed in haste by an author who, among other things, sought to regain his status in Florentine political affairs. (Many of his colleagues in the previous republican government were quickly rehabilitated and returned to service under the Medici.) Originally written for presentation to Giuliano de'Medici (who may well have appreciated it), the dedication was changed, upon Giuliano's death, to Lorenzo de'Medici (the Younger), who almost certainly did not read it when it came into his hands in 1516. Meanwhile, Machiavelli's retirement from politics led him to other literary activities. He wrote verse, plays, and short prose, authored a study of The Art of War (published in 1521), and produced biographical and historical sketches. Most importantly, he composed his other major contribution to political thought, the Discourses on the Ten Books of Titus Livy, an exposition of the principles of republican rule masquerading as a commentary on the work of the famous historian of the Roman Republic. Unlike The Prince, the Discourses was written over a long period of time (commencing perhaps in 1514 or 1515 and completed in 1518 or 1519, although again only published posthumously in 1531). The book may have been shaped by informal discussions attended by Machiavelli among some of the leading Florentine intellectual and political figures under the sponsorship of Cosimo Rucellai. Near the end of his life, and probably as a result of the aid of well-connected friends whom he never stopped badgering for intervention, Machiavelli began to return to the favor of the Medici family. In 1520, he was commissioned by Cardinal Giulio de'Medici to compose a history of Florence (the so-called Florentine Histories), an assignment completed in 1525 and presented to the Cardinal, who had since ascended to the papal throne as Clement VII, in Rome. Other small tasks were forthcoming from the Medici government, but before the opportunity arose for him to return fully to public life, he died on 21 June 1527.
- 3. Traditionally, political philosophers of the past posited a special relationship between moral goodness and legitimate authority. Many authors (especially those who composed mirror-of-princes books or royal advice books during the Middle Ages and Renaissance) believed that the use of political power was only rightful if it was exercised by a ruler whose personal moral character was strictly virtuous. Thus rulers were counseled that if they wanted to succeed—that is, if they desired a long and peaceful reign and aimed to pass their office down to their heirs—they must be sure to behave in accordance with conventional ethical standards, that is, the virtues and piety. In a sense, it was thought that rulers did well when they did good; they earned the right to be obeyed and respected on account of their moral and religious rectitude.
- 4. Machiavelli criticized at length precisely this moralistic view of authority in his best-known treatise, The Prince. For Machiavelli, there is no moral basis on which to judge the difference between legitimate and illegitimate uses of power. Rather, authority and power are essentially coequal: whoever has power has the right to command; but goodness does not ensure power

and the ruler has no more authority on account of being good. Thus, in direct opposition to morally derived theories of politics, Machiavelli says that the only real concern in politics is the acquisition and maintenance of power (although he talks less about power per se than about "maintaining the state"). In this sense, Machiavelli presents a trenchant criticism of the concept of authority by arguing that the notion of legitimate rights of rulership adds nothing to the actual possession of power. The Prince purports to reflect the self-conscious political realism of an author who is fully aware—on the basis of direct experience in the service of the Florentine government—that goodness and right are not sufficient to win and maintain political supremacy. Machiavelli thus seeks to learn and teach the rules of political power. For him, it necessary for any successful ruler to know how to use power effectively. Only by means of its proper application, Machiavelli believes, can individuals be brought to obey and will the ruler be able to maintain the state in safety and security.

- 5. Machiavelli's political theory, then, excludes issues of moral authority and legitimacy from consideration in the discussion of political decision-making and political judgment. Nowhere does this come out more clearly than in his treatment of the relationship between law and force. Machiavelli acknowledges that good laws and good arms constitute the dual foundations of a well-ordered political system. But he immediately adds that since coercion creates legality, he will concentrate his attention on force. He says, "Since there cannot be good laws without good arms, I will not consider laws but speak of arms" (Prince CW 47). In other words, valid law rests entirely upon the threat of coercive force; authority is impossible for Machiavelli as a right apart from the power to enforce it. Machiavelli is led to conclude that fear is always preferable to affection in subjects, just as violence and deception are superior to legality in effectively controlling them.
- 6. Machiavelli cannot really be said to have a theory of obligation separate from the imposition of power; people obey only because they fear the consequences of not doing so, whether the loss of life or of privileges. And of course, power alone cannot bind one, inasmuch as obligation is voluntary and assumes that one can meaningfully do otherwise. Someone can choose not to obey only if he possesses the power to resist the ruler or is prepared to risk the consequences of the state's superiority of coercive force.
- 7. Machiavelli's argument in The Prince is thus designed to demonstrate that politics can only properly be defined in terms of the effective employment of coercive power, what Yes Winter (2018) has termed "the orders of violence." Authority as a right to command has no independent status. He substantiates this assertion by reference to the observable realities—historical and contemporary—of political affairs and public life as well as by arguments revealing the self-interested tendencies of all human conduct. For Machiavelli it is meaningless and futile to speak of any claim to the authority to command detached from the possession of superior political power. The ruler who lives by his supposed rights alone will surely wither and die by those same rights, because in the rough-and-tumble of political conflict those who prefer power to authority are more likely to succeed. Without exception the authority of states and their laws will never be acknowledged when they are not supported by a show of power which renders obedience inescapable.
- 8. Machiavelli presents to his readers a vision of political rule allegedly purged of extraneous moralizing influences and fully aware of the foundations of politics in the effective exercise of power. The methods for achieving obedience are varied and depend heavily upon the foresight

that the prince exercises. Hence, the successful ruler needs special training. The term that best captures Machiavelli's vision of skill that must be learned in order to engage successfully in power politics is virtù. While the Italian word would normally be translated into English as "virtue", and would ordinarily convey the conventional connotation of moral goodness, Machiavelli obviously means something very different when he refers to the virtù of the prince. In particular, Machiavelli employs the concept of virtù to refer to the range of personal qualities that the prince will find it necessary to acquire in order to "maintain his state" and to "achieve great things", the two standard markers of power for him. This makes it brutally clear there can be no equivalence between the conventional virtues and Machiavellian virtù. Machiavelli's sense of what it is to be a person of virtù can thus be summarized by his recommendation that the prince above all else must possess a "flexible disposition". That ruler is best suited for office, on Machiavelli's account, who is capable of varying her/his conduct from good to evil and back again "as fortune and circumstances dictate".






