

PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Government General Degree College, Chapra is established in the year 2013 in the outskirts of the village Shikra, JL No- 23, P.S. Chapra, Dist. Nadia. The college is established by the approval of the Cabinet vide Memo No.Edn(A)/10M-9/13, dated 30.10.2013 with the concurrence of the order in the Department of Finance, Government of West Bengal. It is a rural Undergraduate General Degree College affiliated to the University of Kalyani. It is one of the four newly established public colleges in the district of Nadia. With a total area of 4.83 acres of land, the lush green verdure of the sprawling campus soothes the eyes. The college is surrounded by enriched cultivated crop fields possessing both cultivated and wild crop relatives. naturalized and exotic flora and fauna of Indo-Bangladesh origin. In addition to it, the rich animal habitats surrounding the place especially the diversity of snakes are found in the local area. It becomes an attractive biodiversity hotspot for researchers in the field of herpetology. The college promises to be a world biodiversity study centre in very near future as well. Primarily catering to the interests of the rural poor community in the neighboring areas, the college has since its inception worked ceaselessly towards the spread of education among the poor students and rural communities inhabiting the areas. Every year it has been seen that there is a steady increase in the number of student enrolment in various academic departments. The college offers undergraduate programs in both Humanities and Science subjects.

Major/Honours course programs are offered for five Humanities Departments viz., English, Bengali, History, Political Science and Sociology, and three Science Departments viz., Chemistry, Mathematics and Physics. The dedicated faculty members of the institution provide their complete co-operation in fostering a strong academic integrity and encourage the students to follow the path of excellence.

Facilities and Infrastructure

The college has a three-storeyed building and promotes an eco-friendly campus. Along with the usual classrooms, it provides excellent state of the art infrastructure with laboratories, library, computer rooms, administrative block, teachers' rooms, separate common rooms for boys and girls, one audio-visual room, seminar rooms, and multipurpose hall for undertaking large scale programs. To enhance games and sports activities, the institute has built volleyball and basketball courts and has a playground as well. There is a small enclosed area inside the college with sitting arrangements where students can sit, talk and take respite in between the class hours as well.

Teaching and Learning

As per the directives of UGC and the Department of Higher Education, Government of WestBengal, the teachers of the college are regularly engaged in taking classes through offline mode. The institution has taken special care towards the poor and underprivileged students of the area by taking classes through video conference call as well. In future the institution intends to help students more and tries to look after their interests always.

NSS:

The college has its own NSS Unit. The NSS (National Service Scheme) is under the Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Government of India. SCIENCE LABORATORIES: -

Physics Laboratory-

The Department of Physics of GGDC, Chapra offers 'state of the art' laboratories so that students can have a hands-on experience of all the modern experiments in Physics. The Department has three main laboratories:

- 1. General Lab (Ground Floor)
- 2. Optical Lab or dark Lab (1st floor) and
- **3. Electrical and Electronics Lab** (1st floor).

All the labs are well-equipped and full of latest instruments related to electricity, sound, light and many more which enable the students to get a concept of basic Physics. Set-up of few experiments has always been kept ready to demonstrate the basic Physics, and for the rest of the set-up, particularly in case of optical experiments, students are being engaged to get a hands-on experience during the experiments. Teachers are always ready to discuss with the



students and try to address their problems and

doubts which generally arise during the experiments. Most of the theory classes have been taken at Physics laboratories so that the teachers can share their knowledge of theory along with the experimental concept. Besides the Physics laboratories, the Department of Physics also offers computer facilities to our students to enhance their knowledge in the area of computer machine languages e.g. FORTRAN, C, C++, Python etc.

Chemistry Laboratory

The Department of Chemistry and its laboratory has started functioning since the year 2016. Since then, our laboratory is being improved day by day very rapidly. We know that practical work in a laboratory is essential for students to explore the deep understanding of fundamental science like Chemistry. Being a government college, we are fortunate enough to have three well-equipped laboratories for the organic, inorganic and physical chemistry. We have a conductometer, P^H meter, refractometer, four digit accurate balance, magnetic stirrer and many other instrumental facilities in our laboratory. In addition to this, all types of valuable chemicals, glassware, excellent pipeline of water and gas facilities are also available in the laboratory premises. Therefore, science students after 10+2, are heartily welcome to our college and they can play with colours of chemistry in order to develop their intellect and establish themselves for the future.

LIBRARY: -

The College has a central library facility for the students. The library is large, well-stocked with a collection of about thousand books on different disciplines. The students can make the best use of the quiet Reading Hall by gleaning valuable bits of insight and information from the handy reference books and study materials. The library is being enriched every year with new publications which are necessary for the students for preparing their study materials. The reading room facilities are also available for the students.









Smart Classroom

The college believes in creating a holistic environment for learning among the students. Faculty members are dedicated to impart useful knowledge and skills to the students. AV Room (Audio-Visual Room) and Smart Classrooms in the college use information technology to help the students in grasping lessons quickly. Seminar Halls and lecture theatres provide ample space for cultural programs to be conducted in the premises of the college.

- vii. Chemistry [4-Year UG Degree (Honours/ Honours with Research)]
- viii. Mathematics [4-Year UG Degree (Honours/ Honours with Research)]

Eligibility Criteria for Admission 2023-2024:

4-year (Eight Semester) UG Degree Courses (Honours/Honours with Research) are offered to the candidates who have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) Examination in general conducted by the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or an equivalent examination conducted by other State Board/Council, or The W.B Council of Rabindra Open Schooling, or The National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) recognised by the Distant Education Bureau (DEB) subject to fulfilment of the criteria mentioned below:

[In case of other Boards/Councils, a candidate shall have to pass in five recognised subjects, of which one shall be English, a full marks not being less than 100 each. Those applying for admission under Sports Quota shall still need to fulfil the minimum eligibility criteria of respective subject as well as the eligibility criteria from respective sporting discipline.]

- ➤ Candidates who have passed Higher Secondary (10+2) or equivalent examination in 2023 (or 2022) from any recognized Board are eligible to apply for admission to First Year.
- As per the decision of the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, there is no need to pay for filling up the college admission form.
- > Students can apply only through the online portal as per the First Year Admission notice of the college.
- > Students will have the opportunity to be admitted to the college on the basis of merit.
- > To apply for admission in the first year they must comply with the rules laid down by the University of Kalyani and College authorities.
- As per the reservation policy of the Government of West Bengal, SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B and Physically Challenged candidates are eligible for reservation quota.
- ➤ Anti-ragging declaration as per the UGC norm is mandatory at the time of admission.
- During the time of admission two attested copies (Attestation to be done by Head of the Institution last Attended) of the following documents have to be submitted:
 - 1. Class X Admit Card
 - 2. Class XII Mark Sheet
 - 3. First page of Bank Pass Book
 - 4. Caste Certificate (If applicable)
 - 5. Original Character Certificate (from school last attended)
 - 6. 2 copies of recent passport size photograph (Not Attested)
 - 7. 1 copy of Aadhar Card.

COURSE OFFERED

4-YEAR CURRICULUM FOR ARTS AND SCIENCE DEPARTMENTS ADMISSION SESSION 2023-2024

GGDC Chapra offers a 4-year (8 semesters) UG degree (Honours & Honours with Research) program for Five Humanities subjects & Three Science Subjects

THERE ARE 7 TYPES OF COURSES IN THE NEP CURRICULUM:

Major

The Major Course is the subject in which the degree will be awarded [e.g., B.A. (Honours/ Honours with Research) in Bengali]. The Major provides the student an in-depth study and training in a particular subject. The academic level develops progressively till it reaches advanced levels in the later semesters.

Minor

The Minor subjects are generally complementary to the Major subject and are designed to help the student obtain a broader understanding of subjects related to or beyond the Major course [e.g., B.A. (Honours) in Bengali with History and Sociology]. The second Minor will be chosen by the student in the beginning of 2nd semester. Refer to Section 3 below for details.

Multi-Disciplinary (MDC)

Multi-Disciplinary Courses are courses from other disciplines. All the students are required to take 3 introductory-level courses, one in Semester 1, one in Semester 2 and one in Semester 3. These courses are intended to broaden the student's intellectual experience and they form part of liberal arts and science education. Refer to Section 4 below for details.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

The AEC includes courses in a) Compulsory English (Communicative English)- Semester 2; b)

Modern Indian Language (MIL)—Semester 4. The emphasis in these courses is on language, communication skills, critical reading, and academic writing skills to enable students to express their ideas and arguments coherently in written form and in discussion and debate.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

Skill Enhancement Courses are designed to impart practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc. All the students are required to take this course, one in Semester 1, one in Semester 2 and one in Semester 3. University of Kalyani proposed Course Structure as per the NEP-2020.

Value-Added Courses (VAC)

Value-Added Courses include courses in Understanding India, Environmental Education,
Digital and Technological Solution, Inter-religious studies & Health & Wellness. University of
Kalyani proposed 1 course in Semester 1 (Environmental Education) and one course in
Semester 3 (to be announced) of 4 credits each.

Internship

Internship is a novel aspect of the UG program to allow students to obtain experience in industry, research labs, business, community service, learning projects. <u>University of Kalyani proposed Summer Internship Programmes (optional) in Semester-2 and Semester-4 of 4 credits each and there is Outreach/Internship Programme (mandatory) of 2 credits in Semester-6.</u>

In each semester the candidate will study a combination of the above-mentioned courses with each course assigned a specific number of papers, credits. See the table below:

3. MULTI-DISCIPLINARY COURSES:

Details of the Multi-Disciplinary courses will be provided by the affiliating University in due course of time.

MDC must be from one of the subjects the student does not have in 10+2.

4. 4-YEAR UG DEGREE (HONOURS WITH RESEARCH/HONOURS)

- a) Students who secure 75% marks and above in the first 6 semesters will be eligible to undertake research in the 4th year. The research project/ dissertation will be supervised under the guidance of the departmental faculty members. The research project/ dissertation is for 12 credits. These students will be awarded an Honours with Research degree.
- b) In Semester 8, students who are not undertaking research will complete three papers for 12 credits in lieu of the research project/ dissertation. These students will be awarded an Honours degree.

5. EXIT OPTION

- a. 1-YEAR UG Certificate: A UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a skill based vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 40 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (07) years.
- b. **2-YEAR UG Diploma**: A UG Diploma after completing 2 years (4 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study, provided that a skill based vocational course (additional 4 credits) must be completed during the summer term by the students who will exit the programme after securing 80 credits. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven (07) years.

c. 3-YEAR UG BACHELOR DEGREE: A student who chooses the exit option after completion of the third year [after completion of 6th Semester] will be awarded a Bachelor's degree with Major so long as the required minimum credits are obtained.

INSTITUTIONAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Attendance

According to the rules of the University of Kalyani, Students failing the requirement of minimum attendance may not be allowed to appear as a regular student in University Examinations. This rule is strictly applicable for UG students.

Percentage of Attendance

- A student attending at least 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.
- A student attending at least 60% but less than 75% of the total number of classes* held shall be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations subject to the payment of prescribed condonation fees and

fulfilment of other conditions laid down in the regulations.

- A student attending less than 60% of the total number of classes* held shall not be allowed to appear at the concerned Semester Examinations and he /she has to pursue admission to the same Semester in the very next year for attending the classes and appearing at the said Semester Examination.
- *Such attendance will be calculated from the date of commencement of classes

or the date of admission, whichever is later.

General Rules

Students must go through the College Notice Board regularly for information.

Students must bring his/her Identity Card issued by the Principal. Polite and respectful behaviour towards the teachers, the non-teaching staff of the college and the fellow students are expected from a student. Students are required to maintain cleanliness. All the students of the college are expected to participate in the college activities like sports and Cultural functions. Authority is not responsible for any loss of personal property.

Guardians are requested to attend Parent-Teacher meetings as arranged by the College.


A. Seminar/Webinar/Workshop
